Dear Marcellus KCH Parents and Guardians:

On Friday afternoon, the Marcellus School District was made aware that a KCH student has tested positive for COVID-19. We were able to complete all of our internal contact tracing duties by Friday evening and send that information to the Onondaga County Health Department. They will be completing their work over the course of the weekend.

We were able to contact families of all students believed to be in “close contact” with the infected individual to alert them of the possibility of quarantine. We also contact families of students in the B cohort of the affected class. While none of those students were considered close contacts, we wanted to inform them of the temporary absence of the teacher. If you were not contacted, there is no need for concern. We do not believe that this situation will necessitate the closure of KCH but rather having one of our cohort classes function virtually during this period of quarantine. At this time we believe that approximately eight staff members and seven students will be impacted. In this situation, the teacher of the quarantined cohort will make contact with impacted families and establish a plan and schedule for virtual learning to occur immediately.

We anticipate hearing from the health department at some point over the weekend and at that time will inform families of their child’s status and the dates of quarantine if applicable.

In addition to following the recommendations of the Onondaga County Health Department, we will continue to deep clean and sanitize our school buildings, as we have done each day, in addition to following all safety procedures and protocols. The student who tested positive, and any other students/faculty/staff who were considered to be in “close contact”, will not return to school until the Onondaga County Health Department provides clearance for them to do so.

Due to legal considerations, we cannot provide any additional information to you about the identity of the student who tested positive. We ask that you continue to encourage your children to practice good hand-washing hygiene, wear face masks in the proper manner, and practice social distancing.

If you or a family member start to exhibit symptoms of the virus (fever, shortness of breath, vomiting, diarrhea and/or coughing, for example), please reach out to your physician and inform your child’s school nurse. If you do not have a physician, you can contact the Upstate Medical hotline at 315-464-3979. If there are further updates, we will communicate them directly with you using school messenger, and the district website. Our students’ safety is our highest priority. We appreciate your support as we work through this challenging situation together.
