Dear Marcellus DMS Parents and Guardians:

On Saturday evening, the Marcellus School District was made aware that a senior high school student has tested positive for COVID-19. We were able to complete all of our internal contact tracing duties by Sunday night and send that information to the Onondaga County Health Department. They will be completing their work over the course of the next several days.

We were able to contact families of all students believed to be in “close contact” with the infected individual to alert them that their child will likely be quarantined. If you were not contacted regarding a need for your child to quarantine, there is no need for concern. We do not believe that this situation will necessitate the closure of the high school but rather having some of our classes function virtually during this period of quarantine. At this time we believe that approximately two staff members and 34 students will be impacted. In this situation, the teachers of the quarantined students will make contact with impacted students and establish a plan and schedule for virtual learning to occur immediately. Families of quarantined students will hear from the health department official contact tracers at some point over the course of the week due to the fact that the number of cases has risen significantly and they are likely running behind in making their calls.

In addition to following the recommendations of the Onondaga County Health Department, we will continue to deep clean and sanitize our school buildings, as we have done each day, while also following all safety procedures and protocols. The student who tested positive, and any other students/faculty/staff who were considered to be in “close contact”, will not return to school until the Health Department provides clearance for them to do so.

Due to legal considerations, we cannot provide any additional information to you about the identity of the student who tested positive. We ask that you continue to encourage your children to practice good hand-washing hygiene, wear face masks in the proper manner, and practice social distancing.

If you or a family member start to exhibit symptoms of the virus (fever, shortness of breath, vomiting, diarrhea and/or coughing, for example), please reach out to your physician and inform your child’s school nurse. If you do not have a physician, you can contact the Upstate Medical hotline at 315-464-3979. If there are further updates, we will communicate them directly with you using school messenger, and the district website. Our students’ safety is our highest priority. We appreciate your support as we work through this challenging situation together.
