Dear Marcellus KCH Parents and Guardians:

Early this morning, the Marcellus School District was made aware that a KCH staff member tested positive for COVID-19. We were able to complete all of our internal contact tracing duties this morning and are waiting to connect with the Onondaga County Health Department. It is likely that they will be able to complete their work over the course of the weekend.

We were able to contact the families of all students believed to be in “close contact” with the infected individual to alert them of the possibility of quarantine. If you were not contacted, there is no need for concern as far as we know. We do not believe that this situation will necessitate the closure of KCH as long as we are able to secure enough substitutes to cover staff members required to quarantine. At this time we believe that approximately eight staff members and seventeen students will be impacted.

We anticipate hearing from the health department at some point later today or over the weekend and at that time will inform families of their child’s status and the dates of quarantine if applicable.

In addition to following the recommendations of the Onondaga County Health Department, we will continue to deep clean and sanitize our school buildings, as we have done each day, in addition to following all safety procedures and protocols. The member who tested positive, and any other students/faculty/staff who were considered to be in “close contact”, will not return to school until the Onondaga County Health Department provides clearance for them to do so.

Due to legal considerations, we cannot provide any additional information to you about the identity of the staff member who tested positive. We ask that you continue to encourage your children to practice good hand-washing hygiene, wear face masks in the proper manner, and practice social distancing.

If you or a family member start to exhibit symptoms of the virus (fever, shortness of breath, vomiting, diarrhea and/or coughing, for example), please reach out to your physician and inform your child’s school nurse. If you do not have a physician, you can contact the Upstate Medical hotline at 315-464-3979. If there are further updates, we will communicate them directly to you using school messenger, and the district website. Our students’ safety is our highest priority. We appreciate your support as we work through this challenging situation together.
